THINGS TO DO IN GLASGOW

Parks

The **Botanic Gardens** and **Kelvingrove Park** are both a short walk away from the University. Both are free to enter, have children's play areas and cafes within the parks.

Museums

Hunterian Museum & Art Gallery

Housed in the main building of the University of Glasgow, the Hunterian Museum displays archaeological, medical, geological and other scientific collections. Look for the excellent display on the Romans in Scotland which includes distance slabs from the Antonine Wall. Across the street is the Hunterian Art Gallery, which houses an art collection, a reconstruction of one of designer Charles Rennie Mackintosh's home interiors and rotating special exhibitions.

Kelvingrove Museum & Art Gallery
